Call to Order

Public Comments

LoriAnn Trelka described the current services available from the Youth Department and how Youth Services staff are helping parents keep their children engaged and active.

Building reopening plans

Board members discussed current Library operating procedures, the addition of job-related computer use, and the current health climate. Erickson raised her concerns with the current hours of operation and the lack of Sunday open hours. Koller suggested utilizing volunteers when possible. Mayor Kaufert requested information on services and operations for posting at City Hall.

On motion of Fieldhack, seconded by Codner, the Board unanimously approved to add discussion of Library services and operations under the current public health situation to the January 20, 2021 Library Board agenda.

Director Raab stated the Library will add Sunday curbside hours starting January 17, 2021.
