#### Cedar Plank Steaks

1 cedar plank Two to four 1 inch thick New York Strip Steaks olive oil Mad Dog & Merrill's Grandma Hazel's Rub



Soak the cedar plank in water, wine, or beer for at least 2 hours. Rub your steaks lightly with olive oil and season with Mad Dog & Merrill's Grandma Hazel's Rub or your favorite seasoning. Sear steak on a high heat for about 2 minutes on each side. Place cedar plank on the grill and put your steaks on the plank and turn your heat down to a medium heat. Close the hood and grill for about 15 minutes or desired doneness. Please note that you can do the same thing with pork chops and pork steaks.

## SUMMER OF AWESOME READING!

With the end of the school year approaching, the Youth Department is gearing up for another busy summer! Year-round storytimes for our littlest library users continue into the summer months packed with stories, songs and movement. Family programming features professional performers sharing music, nature and magic. We offer librarian led programs like book clubs, science exploration and art projects. Each year as we plan our summer programming, we explore new ways to engage readers of all ages. This year we look forward to new programs like Tween Scene, weekly projects just for tweens and teens, and STEAMy Summer, weekly activities incorporating STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art & Math).

Children from birth to age 18 can register for the reading component of the Summer Library Program and earn incentives for reading, being read to and other literacy activities. We will offer three different reading records based on the age of the participant. Each reading record will include age appropriate literacy activities. Ultimately summer at the library is about keeping kids reading when school is out and avoiding the "summer slide". Experts agree that children who read during the summer gain reading skills, while those who do not often slide backward. Summer slide affects millions of children each year in this country—but it doesn't have to. Libraries and librarians play a huge role in promoting summer reading and making reading fun for children and families. We make an extra effort to reach children and families who may not be familiar with our library and library services through outreach and promotion. Keep your eye out for SOAR yard signs popping up around town. We can't wait for another Summer Of Awesome Reading!
